## Washington DC Update...

Though very small in land area (if it were a state, it would rank last behind Rhode Island), Washington DC is one of the busiest, most densely populated and highest crime areas in the world. It has two international airports and more museums than almost any metropolitan city. Indeed, the "city" of Washington DC is many things to many people. What do you think of when you hear "Washington DC" or see a picture of one of its many landmark monuments? Most people, when they think of Washington, think of one of three things.

First, many people think **INFLUENCE** when they think of DC. Washington is, without doubt, one of the most influential cities in the world. From the White House to Embassy Row, DC is alive and buzzing with movers, shakers and "influence peddlers." A number of years ago, as we were planning for our first DC Crusade, Betsy and I had the privilege of eating in a small cafeteria in the basement of the Capitol building. All around us were people whose faces I'd seen on T.V. I commented to Betsy that I could "understand how someone could come to this city with the highest of ideals, only to be corrupted by the awesome aura of power that permeates everything here." Many have done exactly that. One has to look only casually at the political scene to see men and women who have sold their soul in exchange for temporary influence.

Second, some, when considering Washington DC, think **INTIMIDATION**. With its high profile buildings and even higher profile people, DC can most definitely be an intimidating place. I will never forget the dazed look on the faces of teens, during past crusades, as we've challenged them to pass out tracts



and witness in our nation's capital. The nervous excitement of seeing some politician "on the street" has caused teens to initially feel like they were totally out of place. Yet, by week's end the same teens are infused with boldness and confidence as they've seen God work in life changing power, saving those they've spoken to and invited to the crusade services.

While DC is both an influential and intimidating place, it is, first and foremost, a place of **INCREDIBLE OPPORTUNITY**. Tourists from around our nation and various parts of the world flock to DC in June. If the weather is good, the streets and sidewalks around the National Mall are teeming with enthusiastic visitors eager to experience all that DC has to offer. That is why we conduct our crusades at that time of the year. It affords us unparalleled exposure with the gospel of Christ. I urge you to set aside the week of **JUNE 10-15**, and join us for an absolutely awesome six days of ministry that will leave you forever changed.

Our ministry team will be in DC two weeks this summer. In addition to the crusade week, we will be

We believe that the two weeks together will provide unprecedented opportunity for gospel impact. Our entire ministry team (Kistler Family, Daybreak Quartet, Jose' Young, Bill and Janet Saunders, Fred and Flo Stoll) and others will all be participating.

Our website will feature periodic updates regarding all the crusade events including the exact location of our tent for the week. Pray for definite direction as to location. We desire to be not only where God wants us to be, but also where there will be the highest traffic flow.

### A Sobering Equation

*"Pride goeth before (precedes) destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall."*

I must confess that in high school, math was not one of my strong points. In fact, algebra, trigonometry, and the like seemed like a total waste of my time. The only math course that made sense to me and seemed even remotely relevant to my future was

Business Math, which I could understand and really "get into."

The most simple of math equations is the addition equation. One number "plus" another number "equals" the end result. Well, the Bible presents a simple, yet sobering addition equation.

That equation is:

$Pride + Time = Judgment.$

Consider the following examples of this serious principle of simple math.

In Daniel 4, Nebuchadnezzar has a troubling dream of a tree whose height reached into the heavens. Once the tree had grown to great significance, it was suddenly cut down to the ground. Daniel, in his interpretation to Nebuchadnezzar, tells the king that the tree is him, and that God will judge his pride and self-sufficiency. Rather than repent of his sin (Daniel 4:27) Nebuchadnezzar struts through his palatial residence saying, "Is not this great Babylon, that I have built...by the might of my power, and for the honor of my majesty?" Twelve months after his dream, Nebuchadnezzar is driven from power by a strange disease (called by many "boanthropy") which caused him to act like an ox, living outdoors, sleeping under the stars and functioning like the basest of animals. His arrogance had brought him low. He was a living, breathing example of the simple, yet profound equation,

Pride + Time = Judgment.

In Daniel 5, Belshazzar, the grandson of Nebuchadnezzar, is lifted up in pride, to the point of having the sacred vessels from the Jewish Temple brought into his drunken party. Wine is poured into these precious instruments without any regard for their sacredness in the sight of God. Suddenly, the fingers of a man's hand appear on the wall behind Belshazzar. MENE MENE TEKEL UPHARSIN are the words etched into the plaster. Once again, Daniel is brought in to interpret these strange words. "You have been weighed in the balance and have come up short," Daniel tells the arrogant king. That night, Belshazzar's kingdom and life are taken from him. Once again, he is a glaring example of the equation, Pride + Time = Judgment.

If there is anything that God despises, it is pride. "Him that hath an high look and a proud heart will not I suffer" (Ps. 101:5). In a day where it is, not only accepted, but encouraged in the business world, to live arrogantly, may we understand that God views pride differently? For the purpose of this article, may I address the sin of SPIRITUAL PRIDE? Years ago, when commenting on a certain Christian organization, my dad said, "They reek with pride, because of all the talent, resources and people they possess. It may take awhile, but, if things don't change, God will bring them low." That prophetic statement was made well over twenty years ago. Only now is it being proven true. While I tremble at the thought and desire nothing but the best for that organization, I must confess that they have had nothing but difficulty and reduction because of their pride.

Dear friends, may we not yield to the subtle temptation of thinking that we are somebody because of what we have accomplished or because of what we don't do. Our separation from the world, ecclesiastically and personally, is no reason for being lifted up in pride. The size or influence of our churches is no reason for us to respond pride-fully. The significance of our training institutions, their excellent music programs and vast fields of study, are no reason for arrogance. "But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ..." (Gal. 6:14) Jesus is our All in All. It is because of Him that we ARE or HAVE anything. He is our Salvation, Security and Future. As Paul said, "I am what I am by the grace of God."

The prophet Micah stated it clearly. May we follow his clear admonition, "He hath showed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to WALK HUMBLY with thy God." (Micah 6:8)

## Mission Trip To England Update...

During the first part of December, 2006, it was our privilege to minister for ten days in the country of England. This was our ninth visit to that spiritually desolate country. The trip was all the more special because we were ministering in the church of my dear friend Larry Curtis, a veteran missionary in England for seventeen years.

In 1987, I met Brother Curtis, who at the time was finishing deputation, sensed a kindred spirit with him and began meeting weekly with he and Pastor Eddie Sapoch for prayer. Those Saturday evening prayer meetings were a source of inspiration, edification and much encouragement to the three of us. When Brother Larry assumed the pastorate of Bethel Free Baptist Church in Birmingham, England, the first two men he invited over to preach were Brother Sapoch and myself. Never will I forget the first prayer meeting I attended with a handful of elderly believers in a tiny Sunday

school room at Bethel. Two hours of intercession seemed like mere moments as we lifted our praise and petitions to heaven. At the end of that prayer meeting, I vividly remember Brother Sapoch asking, "Do we have to leave now?" Never had I been in such a gathering where I sensed the very breath of heaven. It was on that same trip that Bethel's auditorium, a building that would seat approximately 1000, was reopened and rededicated (for 12 years, the congregation had held services in that small Sunday school room). The Lord knit my heart with that body of believers and began a relationship that has continued to this day.

Our trip this past December was our first to Bethel in ten years. What a delight it was to see dear friends whom we have grown to love dearly. In the last five years, Bethel has seen its share of difficulties and blessings. The church is now a wonderful mix of believers of all age groups and nationalities. There is a warmth in the congregation that most American churches would envy. Those who were saved during our past meetings there have grown tremendously and are vibrant Christians. Many others have been added, especially a significant number of college age youth, a real novelty in England. I cannot say enough about the dedication of Brother Curtis, his wife and dear family. They have invested their lives in the people and immersed themselves in the culture so that they can minister effectively.

In addition to many decisions made in the meetings, we were privileged to meet some dedicated Muslim missionaries, from India, who have invited us to minister in east India next year. Pray for God's wisdom and direction on this and two other opportunities to preach the gospel in Muslim countries in the next several years. These are open doors for which I have earnestly prayed in the last few months.

I encourage you, if you have never done so, to take at least one mission trip a year. It is life-changing to visit another culture, get outside your comfort zone, and give of yourself to proclaim the gospel to people in desperate need of a Savior. *"Lift up your eyes and look out onto the fields, for they are white already to harvest." John 4:35*

## Why Evangelism?

There is a disturbing trend occurring in the Church in the west. With many parallels to the first century church in Corinth, some churches are focused on seeking God's power for healing, prosperity, and dramatic displays of spiritual gifts. I believe God still heals, blesses, and gives spiritual gifts, but how does God want his power used? For this answer I believe we must seek His Word. The last words spoken by our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ just prior to be "taken up" are recorded in the first chapter of Acts 1:8 *"But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth."*

I believe that Jesus was very clear that we can receive His power to be a witness. The thought of sharing the "Good News" with a friend, co-worker, or family member can cause apprehension and even fear. What causes this fear that often leads to our inaction in sharing our faith? I believe that the Apostle Paul addressed one reason in the 4<sup>th</sup> Chapter of his letter to that first century Church in Corinth: *"1 Let a man so account of us, as of the ministers of Christ, and stewards of the mysteries of God. 2 Moreover it is required in stewards, that a man be found faithful. 3 But with me it is a very small thing that I should be judged of you, or of man's judgment: yea, I judge not mine own self. 4 For I know nothing by myself; yet am I not hereby justified: but he that judgeth me is the Lord."*

The Apostle Paul points out three courts of judgment. I will speak of only one of these courts to which he gives the least of importance, the court of “public opinion”. This court is supposed to be of least importance, but often times we let this court rule our actions. We fear rejection and what others are going to think of us when it comes to witnessing. We must strive to be “*stewards of the mysteries of God*”. This June many of you will be attending the Washington D.C. tent crusade to be held on the mall in the downtown area. What a wonderful opportunity to share the “Good News” of our Lord Jesus Christ. Even though Brother Dave Kistler will be clearly proclaiming the Gospel each day, only so many people will hear those messages.

Can we be used by God during this week in sharing the Gospel? Can we seek God’s power for such a task? These questions answer themselves. During this week we will be offering training on sharing the Gospel. This training will also include “on-the-job-training” where we will be going out in small teams to seek “divine appointments” in downtown Washington D.C. The thought of teams of saints hitting the mall excites me. Please begin to pray for this endeavor. Also pray for your participation in the training. You may already be comfortable in sharing your faith. Good! We need your input and assistance in training others. I can think of no greater privilege we are given on this planet than being present when one comes to faith in our Lord. I look forward to seeing and working with you in June.

Please pray that the Lord directs us (collectively) to the location of His choosing, and look for confirmation of the site on



- Wisdom and health for Kistlers, Saunders, Stolls, and rest of H.O.P.E. Team
- Complete recovery of our Pastor (recovering from Leukemia)
